#### 1. **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- Meet and greet school groups with a warm and informative welcome briefing.
- Accompany school groups between activities ensuring they get the most out of their visit, introducing activities and trails in the galleries, and showing groups to the Lunch Space and schools facilities.
- Support with Learning Facilitators to set up sessions, and participate alongside accompanying parents and teachers.
- Actively gather feedback from teachers, through feedback forms.

#### 2. TRAINING

This is an excellent opportunity to gain training on engaging young people with museum collections, along with basic health and safety training covering safeguarding.

Ongoing support from our experienced museum learning team will ensure that any gaps in your knowledge or experience is filled.

#### 3. REQUIREMENTS

- An interest in helping children and young people learn.
- Good communication skills with the confidence to deliver a friendly welcome briefing to a group.
- Willingness to collaborate with a small team, and also complete tasks independently.
- A proactive approach to raising any health and safety or safeguarding concerns with staff to ensure the wellbeing of the schools groups is maintained at all times.

#### 4. DATES AND TIMES

We are looking for volunteers who are available one weekday, weekly or fortnightly from 10.00-14.00 during term-time. Due to the level of training and development involved in this role, we would like to invite volunteers who are able to commit to the summer term from 20 April 2020.
