

What is a sorting office?

What happens inside?





Inside a sorting office both postal workers and machines work quickly to get the mail sorted.

Mail sorting machines



Special machines are used to make sorting large amounts of letters and parcels much faster!




Codes and the mail



The machines can read the postcodes and barcodes to correctly sort the letters and parcels.





What is a postcode?



A postcode is a unique set of numbers and letters that identify a street or large building.

For example:

GU1 2AF



Sorting the mail by area





All the mail that is being sent to the same area is grouped together in trollies.

Transporting the mail



The sorted mail is sent to delivery offices around the country and even across the world!
